

CITY OF FRANKLIN RECYCLING PROGRAM

MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED	WHAT <u>CANNOT</u> BE RECYCLED	HOW TO PREPARE ITEM FOR RECYCLING
GLASS	Clear, amber and green glass from beverage bottles and food jars	Window glass, light bulbs, crystal, glass tumblers, ceramics, mirrors, ovenware	Rinse bottles and jars, remove and discard lids. Do not break glass. Labels may be left on.
ALUMINUM, STEEL, AND BI-METAL CANS	Aluminum, steel, bi-metal food and beverage cans	Aluminum siding, toys, lawn furniture, foil trays, paint cans	Rinse cans (crush if space is needed). Push lid down inside of can and wipe out greasy containers.
PLASTICS – PET, HDPE, V, LDPE, PP, AND PS (Items are stamped with #1 through #7 on bottom)	Plastic pop bottles, milk and water jugs, liquid detergent, bleach, softener bottles, and such items.	Bottles that contained cooking oil, motor oil, window cleaner, antifreeze, pump top or spray bottles, foam cups or plates, toys, pesticide or herbicide bottles.	Discard lids, rinse container (crush if space is needed). LIDS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE. BE SURE TO REMOVE AND DISCARD IN TRASH.
NEWSPRINT AND MAGAZINES	Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, office and computer paper, phone books	Christmas or other types of wrapping paper	Put loosely in cart. Do not tie in plastic grocery bags. If you are not using a recycling cart with lid, do not put out on wet days.
CARDBOARD	Clean, corrugated and pressed cardboard cartons (ie. moving and shipping boxes), cereal boxes (inner bag removed), shoe boxes.	Pizza boxes, milk cartons, juice cartons and boxes, take-out food containers, oily, soiled or contaminated cardboard.	Flatten or break down into small enough pieces to assure they don't become lodged in cart. Remove all packing material (ie Styrofoam peanuts, bubble wrap)

If your collection day falls **ON OR AFTER** a weekday holiday, your collection will be 1 day later.
 If your collection day falls **BEFORE** a weekday holiday, there will be no change in pick-up.

BE SURE TO POINT ARROWS ON RECYCLING CART (ON BLUE LID) TOWARD STREET AND MAINTAIN 3 FEET OF SPACE BETWEEN CONTAINERS AND OTHER OBJECTS, SUCH AS VEHICLES.
